Directive Regarding Large Outdoor Venues

The Secretary of Health, in consultation with the Governor, has sole authority over all instances of quarantine, isolation, and restrictions on commerce and travel throughout Arkansas, as necessary and appropriate to control disease in the state of Arkansas as authorized by Ark. Code Ann. §20-7-109--110. Based on available scientific evidence, it is necessary and appropriate to take further action to ensure that COVID-19 remains controlled and that residents and visitors in Arkansas remain safe.

This directive covers outdoor venues for commercial, community, or civic events and activities where an audience, spectators, or a gathering of people are present, such as at concerts, weddings, plays, sporting events, rodeos, races, fundraisers, parades, fairs, livestock shows, auctions, carnivals, and festivals.

Examples of such venues include theaters, arenas, sports venues, race tracks, stadiums, auction houses, amusement centers, and fair grounds.

Gatherings subject to this directive also include, without limitation, community, civic, public, leisure, or commercial events.

- A venue may increase the number of attendees at events to up to 66 percent capacity for the facility with a plan approved by the Secretary of Health or his designee. Plans should be submitted to adh.ehs@Arkansas.gov.
- One hundred (100) people or fewer in attendance is allowed without a requirement to submit a plan.
- The performers/players/contestants must be separated from the audience by at least 12 feet.
- Lines or cues for entrance, exit, making purchases, or for other reasons must be marked or monitored for maintaining a distance of 6 feet between people.
- All seating must be arranged to maintain six (6) feet distancing from occupied seat to occupied seat.

- Household groups may sit together but six (6) feet should be maintained between groups.
- Every other row seating should be unoccupied to provide for 6 feet of physical distancing.
- Face coverings are required for all persons present, except for children under 10 years of age, who are not required, but strongly encouraged, to wear a face covering. Children less than two (2) years of age should not wear a facial covering.
 - For outdoor venues, once attendees are seated and maintaining 6 feet physical distance from others, face coverings may be removed. However, if moving around where social distancing is not achievable, such as in food and beverage areas, or any area where there is confinement such that 6 feet distancing cannot be maintained, the face covering must be put back in place.
 - For events (such as sporting events and concerts) where loud cheering is anticipated, face coverings shall be worn at all times. When seated and maintaining six (6) feet physical distance face coverings may be temporarily removed for the consumption of food or beverage but must be worn at all other times.
- Performers/players/contestants may be without a face covering if they are twelve (12) feet from other persons.
- Signs must be posted at all entrances advising the public not to enter if
 - They have fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, or loss of taste or smell.
 - They have had known exposure to someone with Covid-19 in the past 14 days.
- Signs must be posted at all entrances advising the public that they may wish to refrain from entering if
 - They are 65 years of age or older.
 - They have underlying health conditions including high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, diabetes, severe obesity, asthma, or weakened immunity.
- Hand sanitizer stations must be available at all entrances and exits.
- Refreshments may be served in accordance with the Restaurant Dine-In Operations Directive.
- Catered events are allowed with caterer-served buffets or plated meals.
- The facility, including seating, shall be cleaned and disinfected before and after each use. Frequently touched surfaces shall be cleaned periodically during the course of the event. Products with an EPA-approved emerging viral pathogen claims are expected to be effective against COVID-19. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for these products. - The venue will be subject to Department of Health inspection and the plan submitted shall include a plan as to how compliance with public health guidelines will be assured and enforced.

Please submit the plan as far in advance of the event as possible for timely review.

The host venue is responsible for compliance with the plan and will be held accountable.

Lack of compliance and investigation of complaints may result in enforcement of criminal or civil penalties.
